After participating in the Boys Club's "Brain Zone Program", which helps increase balance and the ability to concentrate, Daniel's doctor was able to reduce his medication. It wasn't long until Daniel began to talk to others and show improvement at school.

The Boys Club provides a home away from home where boys like Daniel can participate in activities that assist with physical, social, and mental development.
