In Iowa, 23% of third grade students are not proficient at reading (2013). These students urgently need your help. Research has documented that after third grade, students transition from learning to read to reading to learn. These few short years present a window of opportunity to build a strong foundation of a lifetime of education and economic success, or put students at risk for negative consequences associated with low levels of literacy. You can make a difference. Commit to serve eleven months as an Iowa Reading Corps AmeriCorps member, and experience lifechanging growth. With your commitment, we can reach our goal to help more Iowa students become successful readers by the end of third grade.



Based on current educational research and with the oversight of literacy experts, Iowa Reading Corps
AmeriCorps members provide daily, one-on-one literacy tutoring to students in Kindergarten through third grade who are just below grade level in reading. Members receive extensive training and support before and throughout their term of service, so an education degree isn't required to be a successful candidate for Iowa Reading Corps.

As an AmeriCorps member, you will join a network of more than 75,000 Americans each year who commit to national service. AmeriCorps members serving with Iowa Reading Corps will join the strong national service network in Iowa, and commit to the core need of education. Service does not end with tutoring. In partnership with local United Ways and school districts, members will also support volunteer and community engagement projects and will participate in summer reading and academic enrichment programs. These efforts will support the long-term commitment of the community to education and future students.

Eleven months that shape a lifetime

The students are not the only ones who gain skills. During your 9-11 months of service, you too will experience life-changing growth while you:

- Build your career skills, network and resume
- Earn a yearly living stipend of \$12,630 for full time members and \$6,315 for school year only members
- Receive an education award of up to \$5,815 to repay student loans, further your own schooling or to transfer for a family member (available for members 55+)
- Commit to education in your community and help students learn the skills they need to succeed
- Receive training from experts in the education field to help students build their literacy skills
- Receive other benefits, including health insurance and childcare assistance, if eligible
